



Project “YOUROPE: You in Europe”



Summary/Record of the First Learning/Teaching/Training Meeting Liceul Teoretic Mikes Kelemen, Sfântu Gheorghe, Romania

Sunday, 4th March 2018 – Saturday, 10th March 2018

General purpose:

This was the first short-exchange of students of the project, meant not only to present the work developed by the students in their own countries before the meeting, but also to develop common tasks dealing with the past of Europe. The preparation for the next steps of the project was also guaranteed.

Tasks performed:

a) by/with the students:

- warming-up activities, emphasizing the importance of team work;
- construction of the “Yourope train” (topic: cultural aspects from each country);
- presentation and tour to the town centre (historic places and buildings), with special focus to the Second World War;
- meeting with the representative of the local Jewish community; thus, getting acquainted with local cultural and historical facts;
- focusing on the intercultural exchanges of the German, Romanian and Hungarian communities, by visiting historic heritage sites;
- World War II/Holocaust presentation of books and movies by all involved students;
- “Learning YOUR language”, by attending Hungarian and Romanian classes;
- traditional folk dances;
- workshop on digital storytelling in transnational groups and presentation of the work produced (ICT tool: Canvas);
- felting at the House of Crafts;
- introduction to the topics and ICT tools to create an interactive map with relevant places in Europe during the Second World War;
- visit to historic heritage sites and natural beauties.

b) by the teachers:

- contact with the Romanian school system;
- balance of the work about the II WW produced before/during the meeting in Romania;
- defining the in-between work (March/April/May) in further detail;
- considerations about the activity plan, mobility tool, website, facebook page, eTwinning and the importance of dissemination.





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Evaluation:

Both teachers and students were very satisfied with the work produced. The programme was completely fulfilled and the hosting team showed a great level of responsibility and organization capacity. The hosting by the families was also very good and the travelling students were eager to participate in all moments of the experience. Having the local media invited to the school was also considered important to the visibility of the project.
