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### Summary/Record of the Third Learning/Teaching/Training Meeting

#### General purpose:

This was the third short-exchange of students of the project, meant not only to present the work developed by the students in their own countries before the meeting, but also to develop common tasks dealing with the topics of the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the project. Preparation for the final Transnational Meeting in Turkey (20<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> May 2019) was also guaranteed.

#### Tasks performed:

##### a) by/with the students:

- Visiting tour in the school
- Welcome program in the aula
- “Europe on my school wall”: colocation of the previously selected photos in an emblematic wall of the hosting school as a symbol for the last students’ mobility
- Yourope train: people/innovations from each country that might change the future
- Surprise program in the school for students and teachers
- Mother-tongue activity (learning YOUR language)
- English or Drama lesson
- Games to stimulate self-confidence ability to talk in front of an audience
- Parliament Discussion about Human Rights
- Preparing online learning diaries in transnational groups
- Visiting historical and natural sites, to understand the Hungarian living style and traditions;
- Ice skating and sports activities
- Visiting Agora Science Center
- Activities in the MagicValley: a magic time in the World of Media
- Closing ceremony: evaluation of the meeting and certificates
- Leisure time in the Aquaticum





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### by the teachers:

- contact with the Hungarian school system;
- balance of the work produced before/during the meeting in Hungary;
- defining the work to be done in the future in further detail;
- dividing the report in parts and writing it before coming to Turkey;
- considerations about the activity plan, mobility tool, website, facebook page, eTwinning and the importance of dissemination.

### Evaluation:

All tasks were accomplished as planned and there was a huge level of organization by the Hungarian Erasmus team, Headmaster team, hosting teachers, students and parents, so that everything was prepared in detail and there was even time for some great surprises. The other teachers at school also participated actively in most of the activities, which is highly positive for Erasmus+ projects. All hosting families were very nice and the travelling students felt welcome at all times. Having some institutional representatives invited to the school was also very relevant to the visibility of the project.
